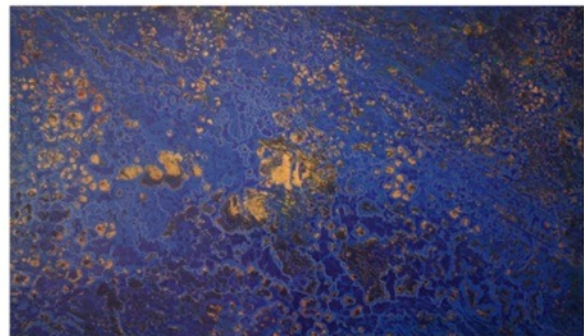
## ABOUT HER ABSTRACT ART

The main theme in Inge Frank's is the color, area, and a dynamically expressive gesture. Inge Frank works mostly with large formats and use alchemist pigments from all sorts of provenances, which allows her to create her own dynamic forms while applying them onto the canvas.

For Inge, it is never about a direct image, it is about the essence of impressions of landscapes, vegetation, people and colors - which come from the depths of meditative research Inge did throughout the years.

The works are created in controlled experimental character in an Alchemist approach. Before going to the practical works - the direction and the motive system is designed to head.

The subjects are lit already in the longer run-up from all sides - that is also usually memorized in writing. Inge sees herself as a type who likes to work out of the abundance - you could even from a Byzantine-inspired style talk-Escalating the color palette - this process is a real secret trick - the colors are mixed with basic colors who contain pigments and proprietary colour. When starting her next piece of art, she starts working from the bottom up - At the end you might be able to see only the first colour schemes Inge has used to create this artwork.
